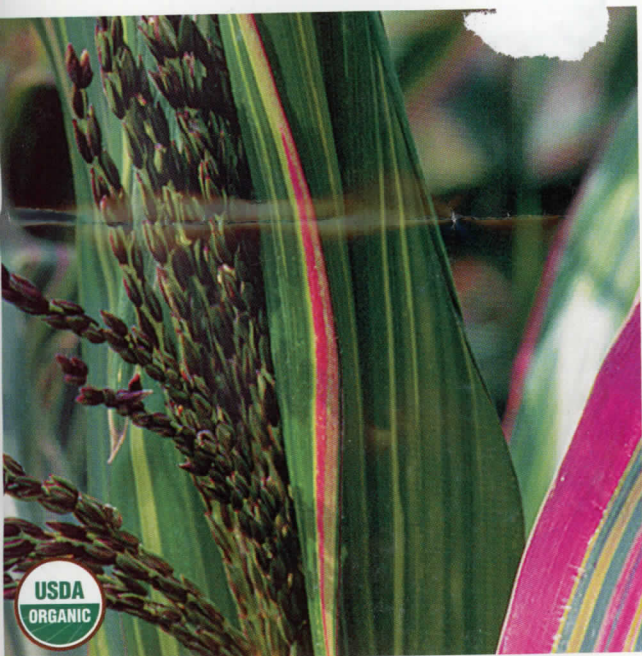

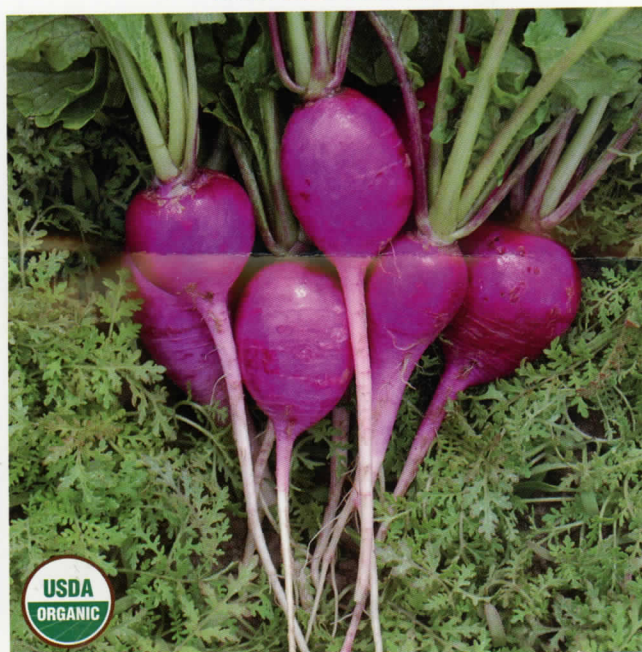

0616A - Japonica Striped Maize (*Zea mays*)

Historic variety - Introduced to the U.S. seed trade before 1950

Magnificent ornamental flint corn from Japan; known in the 1890s as Striped-Leafed Japanese Maize. Variegated leaves striped with green, white, yellow, and pink. Tassels are dark purple, kernels are burgundy. Beautiful when planted as a border. Color develops better when plants are widely spaced. Can be ground for corn meal. 85 days.

Learn To Grow It

Direct Seed	Germination	Rows Apart	Light
4" Apart	4-21 Days	36-48"	Full Sun

Instructions- Sow seeds outdoors 1" deep after danger of frost has passed. For good pollination and full ears, plant in blocks of 3-6 rows instead of one long row. Thin seedlings to 8" apart. Corn is a heavy feeder and does best in well-drained, fertile soil with plenty of water.

1218A - Australian Butter (*Cucurbita maxima*)

From our friends at Digger's Garden Club near Melbourne, Australia. A ribbed, salmon-colored drum-like pumpkin with wall-to-wall starchy, high-quality flesh. Excellent for baking, a great keeper. Fruits weigh 7-15 pounds. 90-100 days.

Learn To Grow It

Direct Seed	Seeds to Hill	Thin	Light
1" Deep	6-8 Seeds	To 3-4 Plants	Full Sun

Instructions- Sow seeds outdoors in 12" diameter hills after danger of frost has passed. Hills should be spaced 6' apart in all directions. Can also be started indoors 3 weeks before transplanting out.

1176A - British Wonder (*Pisum sativum*)

Historic variety - Introduced to the U.S. seed trade before 1950

A large-podded dwarf pea of good quality, this high-yielding historic variety was introduced in England by Taber and Cullen circa 1890; W. Atlee Burpee introduced it in America in 1904. Likely a selection of the American Wonder pea, it has short vines that grow to 3' and require trellising. Shell, 50-55 days.

Learn To Grow It

Direct Seed	Seed Depth	Rows Apart	Support
2-3" Apart	1/2 - 1"	24"	Trellis

Instructions- Peas thrive in cool weather. Sow seeds outdoors as soon as soil can be worked in spring. Seeds will germinate in 7-14 days. Plant a row of seeds on each side of the trellis.

1310A - Plum Purple (*Raphanus sativus*)

Released by the Alf Christianson Seed Company, 1985. Unique deep-purple, round roots. Firm, white flesh is sweet and mild all season long and never pithy. Hardy and adaptable. Exceptional variety for the novelty market and also for the home gardener. 25-30 days.

Learn To Grow It

Direct Seed	Seed Depth	Rows Apart	Thin
1" Apart	1/2"	12"	2-3" Apart

Instructions- Sow seeds outdoors as soon as soil can be worked in spring. Plant in full sun. Sow every 3-4 weeks to provide a continual harvest.

1621A - Lime Basil (*Ocimum americanum*)

This basil is known for its zesty lime flavor and aroma. Delicious in salads, salsas, and when used with fish and chicken. Its compact, mounding plants average 20" in height. More heat-tolerant than sweet basil. Annual.

Learn To Grow It			
Direct Seed 1/8" Deep	Germination 5-30 Days	Thin 4-6" Apart	Light Full Sun

Instructions- Sow seeds outdoors when soil is warm and temperature does not drop below 65°F. Can also be started indoors 4-6 weeks before planting out. Make successive sowings for continuous summer supplies. Pinch back flower stalks as they appear to keep plants from bolting. Prefers rich, well-drained soil.

0907 - Climbing French (*Phaseolus vulgaris*)

The beans of this historic variety are excellent for fresh eating—especially when picked young and tender—and its vines bear beautiful lilac flowers. Sweet, stringless, and flavorful off the vine (kids love them!), the snappy, green 4-7" pods cradle shiny, dark-purple seeds when mature. Ever popular, it was once the most widely grown French climbing bean in England, according to *The Beans of New York* (1931). Pole habit, snap, 65-75 days.

Learn To Grow It			
Direct Seed 2" Apart	Seed Depth 1"	Support Trellis, tepee or fencing	Light Full Sun

Instructions- Sow seeds outdoors after danger of frost has passed and soil and air temperatures have warmed. Harvest frequently for increased yields.

0310A - Rostov (*Helianthus annuus*)

Classic Russian sunflower. Heads grow up to 12" in diameter on sturdy 6' stalks. Excellent variety for edible seed production. Annual, 70 days.

Learn To Grow It			
Direct Seed 6" Apart	Seed Depth 1/2"	Rows Apart 24-36"	Germination 10-14 Days

Instructions - Sow seeds outdoors after last frost. Sunflowers prefer full sun to light shade and well-drained, rich soil. Provide support for tall plants.

0119A - Halbert Honey (*Citrullus lanatus*)

Historic variety - Introduced to the U.S. seed trade before 1950

Developed by Mr. H.A. Halbert of Texas and introduced in 1902 by the W. Atlee Burpee seed house. Thirty years later the Steckler Seed Co. of New Orleans still called it "one of the best tasting melons on the market, a favorite". Sweet pink flesh with a crisp juicy texture. The dark green elongated fruit has a thin, somewhat delicate rind. 90-100 days.

Learn To Grow It			
Direct Seed 1/2" Deep	Seeds to Hill 6-8 Seeds	Thin To 3-4 Plants	Light Full Sun

Instructions- Sow seeds outdoors in 12" diameter hills after danger of frost has passed and soil has warmed. Space hills 8' apart in all directions. Seeds will germinate in 4-10 days. Can also be started indoors 4 weeks before transplanting out. Watermelons love heat and prefer sandy or light-textured soils.

1223 - Tennessee Sweet Potato (Cucurbita sp.)

This is the tofu of squashes as it absorbs the flavors of the food with which it is cooked. It has a very mild taste, certainly not sweet as the name might suggest. A white-and-green, pear-shaped winter squash that can grow up to 12 pounds, the variety stores well and has a greenish-white flesh color. Some would recommend that its best use is for decoration only. This squash grows productively in cooler weather. First listed in 1847 by New York seedsman James Thorburn as Green Striped Bell and most likely renamed by Burpee in 1883. 95-100 days.

Learn To Grow It

Direct Seed	Seeds to Hill	Thin	Light
1" Deep	6-8 Seeds	To 3-4 Plants	Full Sun

Instructions- Sow seeds outdoors in 12" diameter hills after danger of frost has passed. Hills should be spaced 6' apart in all directions. Can also be started indoors 3 weeks before transplanting out.

0395 - Red Wethersfield (Allium cepa)

Historic variety - Introduced to the U.S. seed trade before 1950

Also known as Dark Red Beauty, this attractive onion has large flattened globes with purple-red skins. The mildly pungent flesh with red concentric circles is best used fresh for salads and garnishes, rather than kept for extended storage. It is a long-day type of onion, making it well suited to the North, where the longer days of summer help induce bulbing. It was listed as Large Red in 1834 by Hovey & Company of Boston. By 1850, the name Wethersfield was in use by such companies as Comstock, Ferre & Company. 100 days from transplant.

Learn To Grow It

Start Indoors	Germination	Plant	Light
4-6 Weeks before transplanting	4-10 Days	Outdoors 6" Apart	Full Sun

Instructions- Sow seeds indoors in flats 1/4" deep and space 1" in all directions. Transplant outdoors as soon as soil can be worked in spring. Keep onions well-weeded, but avoid cultivating the soil around onions deeply so as not to damage bulbs. Because of their shallow roots, onions need regular watering.

0862 - Oxheart (Daucus carota)

Historic variety - Introduced to the U.S. seed trade before 1950

The heart-shaped roots of this excellent-quality carrot rapidly grow to more than a pound even in heavy soils and are well-suited for storage. This very uniform, true-to-type variety, also known as Geurande, was introduced to the United States from France in 1884 by W. Altee Burpee, as well as by James J.H. Gregory. 90 days.

Learn To Grow It

Direct Seed	Seed Depth	Rows Apart	Thin
1/2" Apart	1/4"	16-24"	To 2-4" Apart

Instructions- Sow seeds outdoors 3-4 weeks before last spring frost, or as soon as soil can be worked. Keeping soil moist throughout the germination period is important to success. Misting the planted area daily or covering is recommended. Carrots are slow to germinate and need steady moisture until germination. Sow successively throughout the season for fresh carrots.

1353 - Apollo (Eruca sativa)

This improved Dutch strain of garden arugula (also known as rocket) is noted for its lack of bitterness and its spicy, large, rounded leaves, which are high in vitamin C. This variety can be harvested three to five times per sowing, functioning like a cut-and-come again crop. 40-45 days.

Learn To Grow It

Direct Seed	Seed Depth	Germination	Thin
1" Apart	1/4"	5-7 Days	1-6" Apart

Instructions- Sow seeds outdoors as soon as soil can be worked and danger of hard frost has passed. For a continuous supply of arugula, sow every three weeks throughout the summer. Best grown in cooler weather. Plant in full sun or partial shade.

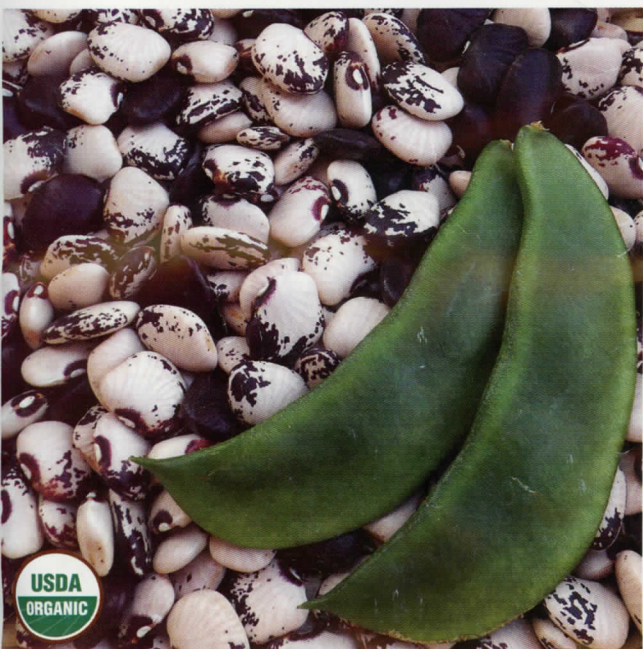

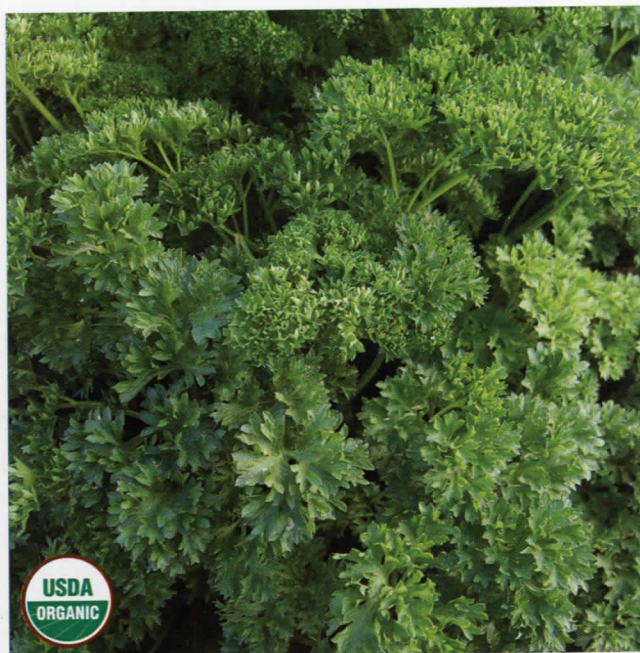

0115A - Wick's (Phaseolus lunatus)

Heirloom variety - Saved and shared by generations of home gardeners

In 2004 Helen & H. Lee Thomas of West Virginia donated this variety to SSE. They received the seeds from H. Lee's grandfather, Wick B. Smith of Sandyville, West Virginia, who had grown this variety since at least the 1930s. Seeds are either white with dark purple mottling or solid purple. The fresh shelling limas are sweet, while dry limas are also nutty. Pole habit, 90-110 days.

Learn To Grow It

Direct Seed	Seed Depth	Rows Apart	Light
2" Apart	1"	36-48"	Full Sun

Instructions- Lima beans thrive in hot temperatures. Sow seeds outdoors after danger of frost has passed and soil and air temperatures have warmed. Seeds will germinate in 7-18 days.

1616A - Gulley's Favorite (Lactuca sativa)

Heirloom variety - Saved and shared by generations of home gardeners

A Seed Savers Exchange staff favorite, this variety's dark-green, round leaves with a tinge of red and slightly undulating edges win us over in the garden, while its crisp texture and great flavor delight us at the table. Donated to SSE in 1992 by Lucille Reeves of Oklahoma, this variety was reported by Lucille to have been grown by the Gulley family of Oklahoma since about 1890. Butterhead, 60 days.

Learn To Grow It

Direct Seed	Seed Depth	Germination	Thin
1" Apart	1/4"	7-14 Days	6-8" Apart

Instructions- Sow successively for a constant supply of lettuce. Best grown in cooler weather. Plant in full sun or partial shade.

0810 - Lemon Mint (Monarda citriodora)

(aka Bee Balm, Horsemint) Used by Native Americans for medicinal and culinary purposes, the citrus-flavored leaves of lemon mint can be minced and added to fruit jellies. Its beautiful purple bracts, held on 24-30" tall plants, are aromatic and colorful in the fall and attract bees. Hardy perennial in zones 5-9.

Learn To Grow It

Start Indoors	Germination	Plant	Light
8-10 Weeks before last frost	10-20 Days	12-24" Apart	Sun/Partial Shade

Instructions- Sow seeds indoors just beneath surface of soil. Transplant in early spring just before last frost. Remove spent blossoms regularly to prolong bloom.

0280A - Triple Curled Parsley (Petroselinum hortensis)

Closely curled dark-green leaves. Fast-growing, uniform strain. High in vitamins and minerals. Holds for a long time at harvesting stage, even in warm weather. Biennial in zones 6-9, grown as an annual. 68-75 days.

Learn To Grow It

Direct Seed	Germination	Thin	Light
1/4" Deep	14-21 Days	6-12" Apart	Sun/Partial Shade

Instructions- Sow seeds outdoors just before last frost. Can also be started indoors and set out as small plants. Parsley seeds can be soaked in warm water for 24 hours before planting. Prefers full sun to partial shade and well-drained, rich soil.
